This is a great achievement and I would like to say a big thank you to the staff for their continued efforts. Also, a special thank you to Mrs Short, for guiding the staff and children to ensure the school has met this standard, and in working so hard to make sure the necessary evidence was submitted to prove our success. This validates St John's commitment to ensuring we provide the best possible provision for all aspects of your child's education and well-being.

Key areas of strength at St John's were highlighted in the following areas:

Involvement of children

There are many worthwhile opportunities for children to contribute to the life of the school and feel a sense of belonging. For instance, they have been antibullying ambassadors and digital leaders; have represented the views of all pupils in the ethos group; made an input to values and learning behaviours and in the case of the school council, lead circle time to gather views.

Parental involvement

St John's Church school has worked hard to help parents feel an important part of the school community. In addition to supporting children in the classroom, they are kept well informed, have given views about values and learning behaviours, have been encouraged to share views in Head's surgeries and been involved in induction activities with children.

Care of staff

The wellbeing of staff is such an important aspect of a successful school and St John's has supported staff by giving them time off timetable, introducing occasional mindfulness in staff meetings and displaying information related to wellbeing.

<u>Visitors to school to support PSHE</u>

St John's is a vibrant school, taking part in many community activities and using a range of resources to support the children's health and wellbeing. We are delighted that the Life Education Bus continues to contribute to the PSHE curriculum and are impressed by the range of other agencies that support health, including the Police/PCSOs, Tesco Farm to Fork, the fire service, RNLI, NSPCC and the school nursing team.

Range of physical activity opportunities

Since the school has started its 'Active Healthy Schools' journey, we have noticed that the opportunities for physical activity have increased. The 'Essential Ingredients' form gives a strong impression of accessible physical activity being encouraged across the whole school day, with support from staff, children and the health-promoting physical environment of the school.

We look forwad to receiving our plaque soon and to welcoming the press into school, who will be covering our achievement. Well done everyone!

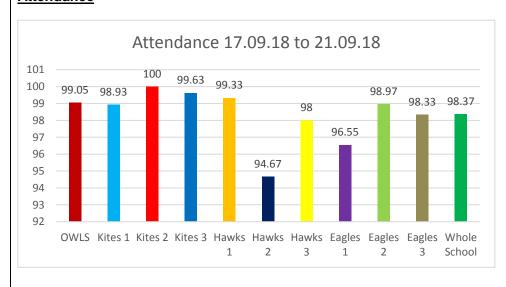
REMINDER TO ALL MISCHIEF-MAKERS
