Art and Design:

Linked to our project on WW2, the children will make some sculptures of soldiers using wire and mod-roc. In addition, we will continue to develop drawing skills in sketch books.

Music:

Using percussion instruments and theory exercises, the children will develop their understanding of rhythm. This will then be used to structure composition and performance, including singing in the second half of term.

English


Oracy:

Religious Education

Understanding Christianity

We have two units from Understanding Christianity this term. The first is looking at The Gospel and the Key Question "What Would Jesus Do?" The children will make clear connections between Gospel texts, Jesus' 'good news', and how Christians live in the Christian community and in their individual lives.

The second unit asks the question "Was Jesus the Messiah?" and is specifically related to Christmas.

Spirituality:

There will be many opportunities for spiritual reflection in addition to those directly related to the learning in RE. In particular, through our study of WW2, the children will have the opportunity to look at the treatment of the Jews and compare that with their own lives. We will of course ensure that this is treated sensitively and in an age appropriate manner.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Geography:

Map work linked to our class text: The Silver Sword. We will trace Jan's journey from Warsaw in Poland to Switzerland.



PSHE and British Values:

Jigsaw scheme:

In 'Being Me in My World' the children will look at setting goals for the year ahead, and beginning to understand how their actions have an impact on others, both within the class and how they can contribute to a better world. In 'Celebrating Difference' the children will be looking at perceptions of 'normal', what it means to have a disability and why some people show bullying behaviours. They will learn that although sometimes differences can lead to difficulties, difference is a cause for celebration.

Outdoor Education:

We will continue to use our outdoor space to support our learning

Science & Technological Understanding

Science:

We have two science topics this term. The first is 'Earth and Space'. The children will develop their understanding of the different parts of our solar system and consider how scientific theories develop over time.



The second is 'forces'. The children will look at forces such as gravity, friction, air resistance and water resistance.

ICT:

Using the Scratch software, children will be developing their coding skills by completing a number of modules that will enhance their knowledge and understanding of coding and allow them to apply this to create a project of their choice.
