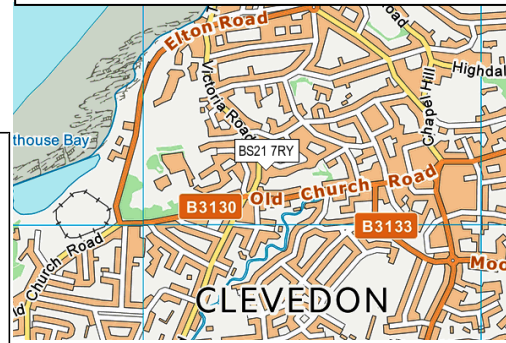


Clevedon is an English town located in North Somerset. It is situated in the South West of England on the banks of the Severn Estuary.

Physical Geography	The branch of geography dealing with the study of natural features of the Earth's surface.
Hills	A landform that extends above the surrounding terrain.
Mountains	A large landform that rises above the surrounding land in a limited area, usually in the form of a peak.
Spring	A natural flow of water from the ground or from rocks.
Coast	Is the land along a sea. The boundary of a coast, where land meets water, is called the coastline.
River	A natural flowing watercourse, usually freshwater, flowing towards an ocean, sea, lake or another river.
Estuary	An area where a freshwater river or stream meets the ocean.
Sea	A portion of the ocean that is partly surrounded by land.
Valley	A low area between hills or mountains typically with a river running through it
Coniferous	Trees or shrubs bearing cones and evergreen leaves.
Erosion	A process where natural forces like water, wind, ice, and gravity wear away rocks and soil.
Human Geography	The branch of geography dealing with the study of people and their communities, cultures, economies, and interactions with the environment
Fort	A fortified place or position stationed with troops
Castle	A castle is a type of fortified structure built during the Middle Ages predominantly by the nobility or royalty and by military orders.
Antiquity	Relics or monuments (such as coins, statues, or buildings) of ancient times
Shelter	A basic architectural structure or building that provides protection from the local environment.
